Genesis 2:15


God took the Man and set him down in the Garden of Eden to. Work the ground and keep it in order.

Extracts from Monmouth news Posted: 22 April 2021

The Church in Wales recently declared a climate emergency – agreeing to have net zero carbon emissions, ideally by 2030, and to divest funds from fossil fuels.

Bishop Cherry Vann, said: "The Governing Body overwhelmingly passed a motion declaring a Climate Emergency, calling on the Church in Wales to draw up an action plan to reach a net zero carbon emission position as soon as possible."

"The question for us is, what are we going to do as a diocese to play our part in saving our planet – God's creation and gift to us? There are many small and simple steps that we can take as individuals, congregations, and at Ministry Area and Diocesan level to help reverse the trends. Churches can aim to become an Eco Church. Working towards an Eco Award (Bronze, Silver and Gold) would be a wonderful way of bringing churches in each of the Ministry Areas together. What an achievement it would be if by the year 2024, we could become an Eco Diocese!"

"This is our chance to show our communities that this is an issue we will join with them to tackle, and our chance to work with and to give the younger generation a voice as we show them that we take their concerns seriously. It is a concern that affects us all." Building awareness is important and the children in family church have been learning about the environment and what they can do to help. Take time to look at their work on the children's altar in church.



God of all creation, open our eyes and hearts to the wonder and beauty of creation; the changing colours of each season, the ancient woodlands and fragile flowers, the mountain streams and ocean depths, and all that grows and lives, ensuring our world is renewed and sustained. * Timothy John Byford, television director, author and educator, who lived in Serbia since 1971, studied birds in Belgrade's Banjica Forest from 1986 to 1989 and collected data on all 68 species. He began an initiative to protect the forest but died in 2014, before the forest was placed under protection. In 2015 The Institute for Nature Conservation of Serbia and the Belgrade City Secretariat for Environmental Protection, declared the forest a <u>natural monument</u> and the name was changed to Byford's Forest.

Celebrating the Coronation

On 7th May The Priory Church of St Mary joined the rest of Usk's community in Bridge Street celebrating the Coronations of King Charles and his Queen Consort in style and with great enthusiasm. Willing volunteers from the church provided a free crown making workshop for children - this proved extremely popular and by 3.00 p.m. 100 crowns had been decorated, assembled and worn with pride by participants, some of whom modelled their crowns in the Fancy dress competition!







And the celebrations continued.

At 6.00 p.m. a crowd of over 200 people flocked into St Mary's for a joyful service of Celebration and Thanksgiving, which was a truly ecumenical and community focussed event. Following a warm welcome by Rev'd Sally, St Mary's Choir and Monmouthshire Community Choir, accompanied by organ and trumpet, joined forces to lead the congregation in a magnificent rendering of Vaughan Williams setting of 'The Old Hundredth '(All People That on Earth Do Dwell), originally arranged for the Coronation of the late Queen Elizabeth II. This was followed by joyous congregational hymn singing, with readings and prayers delivered by representatives from all three Usk churches, the Prison, and the Town Council. St Mary's Choir sang two songs fit for a King and the congregation joined in enthusiastically with the Community Choir's bilingual Welsh Medley.

The service concluded with closing prayers offered by Father Bernard, the two National Anthems and a retiring collection which raised an amazing £584 is to be shared between the church and the Usk Food Kitchen. A big thank you to all who participated in the service and to everyone who donated so generously.
